THE FUTURE of Hornsey Town Hall was on everyone's mind last night.

Campaign group Crouch End for People (CEFP) held a public meeting in Christ Church, Crouch End Hill, to discuss Haringey Council's controversial plans for the Grade II-listed building.

The council wants to sell

the entire complex to a developer and sell off the car park for houses to pay for the £15million renovations. But campaigners want to preserve

the town hall as a community resource. CEFP has distributed 9,000 leaflets around Crouch End and collected more than 1,000 signatures

this week in support of its plans to keep it for the public.

Campaigner Stephen Morpurgo said: "We still think the way forward is through a residents' trust. We agree parts of the town hall need to be sold off for commercial development but we will fight very hard against selling off the town hall car park."
